 - **K4K (Kuwait for Kenya).** Volunteers help Kenyans (especially women and youth in disadvantaged communities) help themselves to establish sustainable projects that contribute to alleviate poverty and give the people access to basic life and health services. However, opportunities in Kuwait may exist to fundraise, promote, and volunteer in other ways.
 - **We Build-India.** LOYAC sends youth on this four-week program every summer. This is designed as a co-curricular service-learning model, as it connects the theory taught in the school to the application used in the world.
 - **Homes Project (Lebanon).** Youths from Kuwait join a similar group of youths in Lebanon to serve the community by renovating homes of poor people and provide them with safe, healthy living conditions.
